Courses for International Students

The courses taught in English—listed on this [link](#)—are designed for both international students (including Erasmus students) and CEVRO Institute students. The courses cover a wide range of topics and disciplines such as Political Science, International Relations, History or Applied Economics. After completion, students are awarded easily transferable European credits. International students are advised to sign up for about 3-5 courses in each semester.

Housing
